

tangram city





urban nomadism



Only drawing a line he could feel his personal link to the world.


The dream of architecture is to become a ship: city without soil that meet dynamic places while only maintaining as a constant the intimacy of the spaces in which guests live.

rainbo(w)at



memento mori



permanent temporariness



curse



suspension / impermanence


